### **The School Committees Report**

The School Committees are dedicated to supporting the school districts' educational goals for Concord, Carlisle and Boston students while maintaining a transparent public process related to policy decisions. This article is one in a series that is intended to update and inform the residents of Concord and Carlisle about the districts' on-going activities, initiatives and policies.

### It's Budget Season

The School Committees are in the middle of budget development for fiscal year 2016 and they are encouraging community members to get involved in the process now and to come vote on the budgets at Town Meeting in April. This report includes background information on budget development and dates and times of upcoming forums that will include budget discussions.

### **Budget Process and Timeline**

The annual budget process begins in June, when the school principals present their annual School Improvement Plans to the School Committees. These presentations include reviewing results from the previous year's plans. These plans are developed at each school site with input from administrators, teachers and parents. During the summer, the Superintendent and the Deputy Superintendent assess the School Improvement Plans and propose budgets to support them. These draft budgets also reflect regular and special education enrollment projections, costs associated with implementing new regulations and the districts' fixed costs. Fixed costs include contractual obligations with eight employee bargaining units, non-union employee salaries, utilities, transportation, insurance and other operating expenses.

In August, the School Committees and the school administration begin working together to fully develop budgets to address the needs of the Concord Public Schools and Concord Carlisle High School and to address the expectations of the taxpayers. In September, the School Committees and the Administration respond to information requests from the Concord Finance Committee. During October and November, the Concord Finance Committee reviews the proposed budgets from the town and the schools and makes a funding recommendation. In December, the School Committees will vote on a final proposed budget for each school district and these budgets will be presented for voter approval at Town Meeting in April.

#### **Cost Drivers**

Over the past five years, fixed costs for the Concord Public Schools grew by 3.67% on average. At the Region, the average rate of growth for fixed costs was 4.52%. These costs include salaries for 700 employees, transportation, utilities and insurance. The operating budgets also include many variable costs. The schools have experienced enrollment growth over the past five years and unfunded state and federal mandates have required training and additional staff time. Also, the school districts face unpredictable special education costs. Public schools are required to provide services to children with disabilities from age three to 21. Many of these children have complex needs and in some cases their needs necessitate out-of-district placements at high tuition rates.

## **Cost Reductions**

In recognition of the economic downturn and the town's generous investment in school building projects, recent School Committees have endeavored to reduce budget increases. These efforts

required reductions in new programming and cuts in administrative staff and funding for educational materials. The Superintendent has led efforts to develop capacity to serve many more special education students in district which has reduced costs. In addition, the districts successfully achieved savings in energy consumption as well as printing and mailing information to parents.

The five-year average increase in operating budgets for Concord Public Schools (CPS) is 3.23% and 2.92% for the Regional District. For FY16, the School Committees are considering restoring cuts made to the budgets over the past few years and funding some new programming that was included in the School Improvement Plans.

## **FY16 Budget Discussions**

As the School Committees continue to work with the administration to finalize the FY16 budgets, they urge residents to engage in the process at upcoming school committee meetings, school committee coffees, Parent Teacher Group (PTG) meetings and Finance Committee meetings.
