The School Committees Report

The School Committees are dedicated to supporting the school districts' educational goals for Concord, Carlisle and Boston students while maintaining a transparent public process related to policy decisions. This article is one in a series that is intended to update and inform the residents of Concord and Carlisle about the districts' on-going activities, initiatives and policies.

Regional District Earns Aaa Bond Rating from Moody's

Citing the Regional School District's history of stable financial operations and a strong financial position, Moody's Investor Services assigned a Aaa rating to the bonds issued to fund construction of the new high school. This exceptional rating allows the District to secure very favorable interest rates which translates into significant savings for tax-payers in Concord and Carlisle.

The report also recognizes the District's history of maintaining its reserves, known as the excess in deficiency account, at the highest levels allowed by state statute. State law allows school districts to fund the excess in deficiency account up to 5% of the subsequent year's operating and capital accounts. City and Town governments do not have the same restriction.

Other factors mentioned in the rating report include the manageable debt burden, support from member towns of debt exclusions, and the sizeable tax base of the towns.

Advisory Committees

The School Committees are in the process of forming three Advisory Committees. These Committees will address the naming of facilities on school property, the school calendar and the future use of alternative fuel buses. Citizens interested in being considered for service on any of these committees should send an email to the School Committee to describe their interest and qualifications for the committee.
