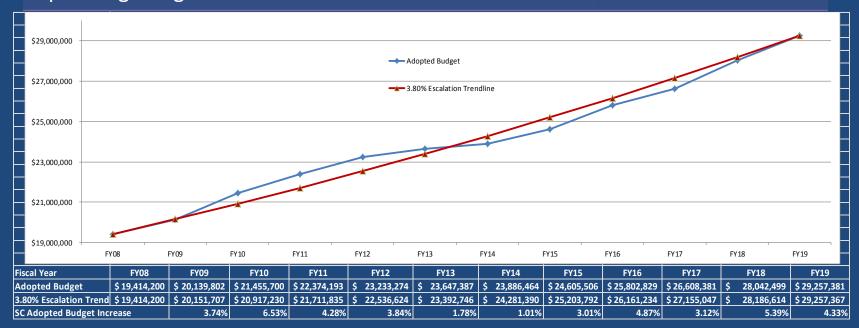

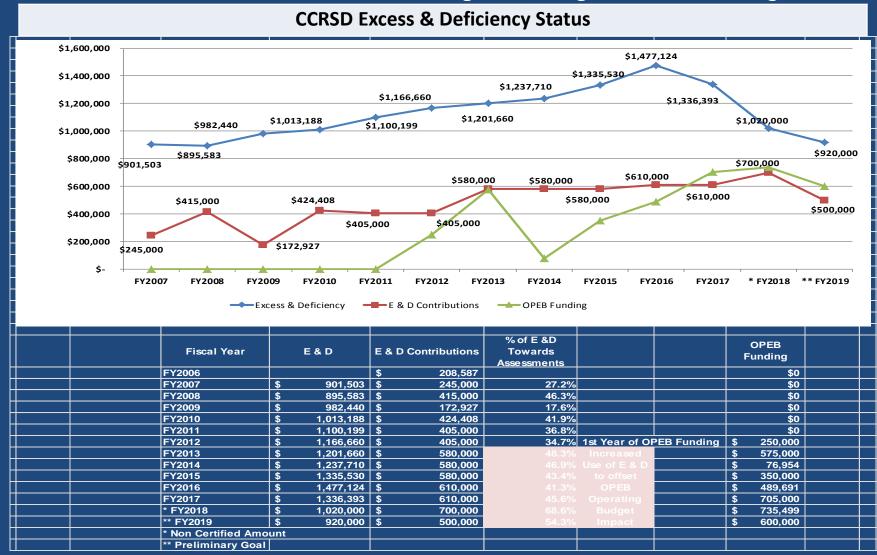

School Psychologist (\$75,000)

- Decreased contact time with mental health professionals for students in need
- There has been an increase in number of students using IEPs, eliminating the school psychologist position hurts some of our most struggling learners

English 1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Increased class size in core classes
 - Particularly in classes for struggling learners as honors courses are already large
- Potential elimination/consolidation of electives
 - World Literature, Twice Told Tales, Vision of the Future, Reading/Writing for the 21 Century

Math 1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Increased class size in core classes
 - Particularly in classes for struggling learners as honors courses are already large
- Decrease in number of levels leading to reduced ability to meet ability needs of students
- Potential elimination/consolidation of electives
 - Biostats, Financial Literacy
- Fewer sections of AP Courses
 - AB Calculus, BC Calculus, Statistics

Science1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Reduced engineering offerings
 - Negatively impacts students working towards engineering certificate
- Reduced electives
 - Meteorology, Geology / Mapping, Forensics,
 Robotics
- Reduced / Eliminated AP Sections
 - Physics 1, Physics C, Biology, Chemistry

Social Studies 1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Larger classes in core
 - Increased class size for World Cultures and US History (grade 9 and 10 courses)
- Reduced / Consolidation of Electives
 - Inhibits students ability to access the classes they choose
 - Psychology, Senior Psych, Economics, International Issues, World Religions, Current Affairs, History of Greece, Sociology, Making Modern America, 19th Century, Presidency, Con Law, Twice Told Tales

World Language 1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Potential elimination of language
- Reduced ability for students to start new languages in high school
 - Potential elimination of introductory courses
- Reduced / Eliminated AP Sections
 - Spanish, French, Chinese
- Reduced offerings for 5th year non-AP students
 - French and Spanish Conversation and Culture

Arts 1.0 FTE (\$75,000)

- Elimination of theater program
- Cuts will be determined by enrollment
- Reduced photography offerings
- Reduced offerings in music
- Elimination of 3D graphics and animation

Tutors 2.0 FTEs (\$75,000)

- Reduced ability to provide direct services with our must struggling learnings in study skills
 - Student teacher ratio increases
 - Current model, which is being reviewed, is heavily reliant on tutors. This cut will reduce tutors by a total of 4.
 - IEP compliance?

Campus Security (\$30,000)

- Afternoon campus security ensures safety in parking lot after school
- No guaranteed supervision of students in dining commons and common spaces before/after sports
- Large portion of school essentially unsupervised after 2:41.

Administrative Assistants 2.0 (\$75,000)

- Reduced support to administrative tasks
- TBD as to specific positions
- Reorganization required
